As we reflect on God's goodness in 2023 we have so much to be thankful for. This, our 10th year of nonprofit Christian ministry has been a blessed one!

During the year God has laid on your hearts to provide funds for 5 houses to be given to families living under a tin roof. God prompted so many faithful and new Recycled Lives supporters to generously provide the funds needed for the food distribution which has touched and changed the lives of 225 families that receive a monthly food package. God is soooo good and Thank You for listening to the prompting of the Holy Spirit to be part of His mission in Guatemala!!

We do have one need that sometimes gets overlooked in ministry. That is giving to the basic operational needs to help keep me and Brad on the ground in Guatemala to carry out the Recycled Lives ministry. Though our projected budget for ministry programs (food, houses, stoves, family care and emergency medical assistance) has been blessed with the gifts necessary to help 100's of people, we are projecting we will be ending the year approximately \$7,000 behind in our operational expense/general fund budget.

Another important way you can help us is to consider beginning a monthly contribution toward our general fund. These funds are what keeps the ministry center operational, provides what we need for ministry supplies, provides maintenance on the mission vehicle, puts gas in the tank to get to families as well as covers rent & utilities for where Brad and I stay.
